MODULE FIVE: CRISIS MANAGEMENT



Overview:

This module is focused specifically on the development of safe and effective crisis management plans – to be considered whenever student behaviors escalate into the acceleration phase. This includes consider-ation of adult behaviors to increase safety.

Big Ideas:

- 1. Teach Standard Consequences During the Calm Stage
 - Build and maintain a positive relationship during instruction
 - Knowing consequences ahead of time allows the teacher to provide the student with a choice
- 2. Non-confrontations Detachments
 - Remain Detached
 - Do not show emotion; be concrete and direct
 - Use a calm monotone voice and avoid direct eye contact
 - Show concern for student with reminders
 - Maintain Non-challenging Proximity
 - Keep some movement avoid hovering
 - After reminding student of choice -turn away or walk a short distance slowly
 - Talk to other students
 - Turn back after several seconds
 - Don't challenge or demand an answer no answer is the same as saying "no"
- 3. Room Clear
 - Move all students and triggers out of sight of a student who is escalating
 - Help move student into the de-escalation phase
 - Do not provide student with attention after room clear
 - Practice it and have it routine
 - Ensure students who leave the room are monitored
- 4. Be Prepared: Crisis Planning
 - Plan ahead
 - Involve all adults when planning for crisis and discuss effective responses to escalating behavior
 - Ensure all understand policy regarding physical restraint
 - Have an agreed upon signal for quick assistance
 - A code word on the phone or radio
 - A colored card that a student carries to others
 - A physical gesture to others

Activity:
