## Bullying

## **District definition:**

"Intimidation or bullying" means any intentional written, verbal, electronic, or physical act or threat which is **severe**, **persistent**, and **pervasive** enough that it may be expected to:

- Harm a student or damage a student's property
- Create fear of harm to a student or fear of damage to a student's property
- Interferes with a student's education or participation in a school-sponsored activity or event.
- Create an intimidating or threatening educational environment

#### Types:

**P**hysical: Use of overt bodily acts, such as hitting, tripping, shoving, slapping, punching, kicking, damaging or destroying personal property, hazing, or biting, to gain power over peers

Verbal: Use of language, such as name calling, teasing, taunting, threatening, cruel criticism, belittling, personal defamation, racist slurs, sexually suggestive and/or abusive remarks, or extortion, to gain power over peers Cyber: Use of any electronic communication device through means including, but not limited to: e-mail, instant messaging, text messages, blogs, mobile phones, pagers, online games, and websites to gain power over peers Relational: The systematic diminishment of targeted student's sense of self with the goal of hurting them or sacrificing their standing within their peer groups. Examples include ignoring, isolating, excluding, shunning, and gossiping.
