WHAT IS A REGISTERED BEHAVIOR TECHNICIAN?

- +An RBT is a paraprofessional, teacher or practitioner who practices under the close, ongoing supervision of a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) or Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA).
- **+**The RBT is primarily responsible for the direct implementation of behavior-analytic services, but does not design intervention or assessment plans.
- +A person who has completed the requirements to be nationally credentialed.

RBT SPECIAL SKILL SET

- **+**Understand how to improve child's behavior through reinforcement
- +How to teach children new skills
- **+**How to work effectively with teachers, service providers, etc.
- **+**Effectively Monitor progress
- **+**Understand how to assess skills and behavior
- +Know how to make data driven decisions
- +Use strategies to reduce problem behaviors
- +Implement intervention plans with fidelity
- +Continued skill refinement through on-going supervision


WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF HIRING A REGISTERED BEHAVIOR TECHNICIAN?
