

~80% of Students



How Adults Change the Probability of Behavior



Discipline is the actions parents and teachers take to increase student success (Charles, 1980).


Prevention Rules, Routines, Arrangements

Fixing the Environment Works When . .

We create more positive than negative outcomes (i.e. success > failure)



Assessing predictable relationships between the environment and behavior

- Involves gathering information from all those who know student
- Predict when/where behavior problems will occur
- Determine why problems occur
- The purpose is to get the information necessary to create a successful plan
