

RECRUITING TEACHERS OF STUDENTS WITH VISUAL IMPAIRMENTS & CERTIFIED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS


The Kansas State School for the Blind (KSSB) Field Services Outreach Department collaborates with both KSDE and the TASN Coordination project to recruit and train Teachers of Students with Visual Impairments (TVI), and Certified Orientation and Mobility Specialists (COMS). This includes KSSB providing pre-service mentoring to support participants in-training on-site. Additionally, participants complete an immersion experience at KSSB which fulfills the student teaching and/or internships requirements of their program. The TASN grant pays for tuition and fees, books, and some travel while participants are attending the out-of-state graduate level teacher preparation programs.



TVI / COMS TRAINING

Teachers of Students with Visual Impairments & Certified Orientation and Mobility Specialists Preparation and Mentorship project supports the training of licensed teachers to become










its ninth year of operation. TVI training is provided through the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and Missouri State University. COMS and/or COMS/TVI (dual-certified) training is provided through Texas Tech University.



To date, 27 individuals have completed the program and 14 are currently in training. With the exception of one recent retiree, all individuals who have thus far completed training within the five-year 2012-2017 State Personnel Development Grant cycle are still working as TVI/COMS in Kansas. Additionally, all 27 individuals who have completed training participated in the eMSS program during or after completion of their TVI/COMS training.
